Recently, they reached out to RCD for our *Disability Awareness and Sensitivity Training* course. Ian and Jhun delivered this latest session.



Groups are given the option of either a one-hour presentation or a longer 1 1/2 hour presentation which goes into a little bit more history of disability. Ian tells me that the Centre teaches about one session per month.

Groups can be as small as four people or as was the case with one taxi company, over 100 participants. Each group is charged a fee for the course, but your support also helps us to offer these sessions and to remove the barrier posed by a lack of understanding. Richmond's Fairchild Media and Richmond City Hall have also participated in RCD led training sessions.
