RCD's Ruby Red 40th Anniversary Gala

With RCD directors, staff, and supporters present at the gala, 40 years of passion and devotion personified truly made the night shine ruby red.

The night began with Jonalen Gamis singing the national anthem while Caroline Ng accompanied on the pipes. From there, city representatives Mayor Malcolm Brodie, Kelly Green MLA Richmond-Steveston, and Teresa Wat MLA Richmond-Bridgeport commemorated the UN International Day of Persons with Disabilities with the BC Government and City of Richmond Proclamations. Afterwards, RCD Directors, Penny Chan and Renee Leung led inspiring speeches celebrating RCD's successful year of service and advocacy for the community.

After the speeches, lively musical performances brought cheers from the audience. From individual performances by Winnie Kwok, Jonalen Gamis, Wilson Tam, and RCD Staff Sunny Leung and Carmen Lee, to a duet by Elsa Wong and Mayor Malcolm Brodie and a group performance led by Gail Liao (Deyi Dance School), the night sparkled with wondrous artistry.

Afterward, the guests were treated to plates of seafood delicacies from the Continental Seafood Restaurant chefs, with the Sauteed Scallop & Cuttlefish with Vegetables in Bird Nest and Beef with Mushroom in Black Pepper Sauce being the favourite dishes.



As always, the silent auction and 50/50 draw drew great enthusiasm, and gala-goers fiercely cheered during the raffle and Passion in Action bingo afterward.

All in all, this year's gala raised \$18,690.00 from sponsorships, donations, and raffle tickets towards offering services for people with disabilities.
