Both ladies entertained the crowd with both Chinese and English language songs. 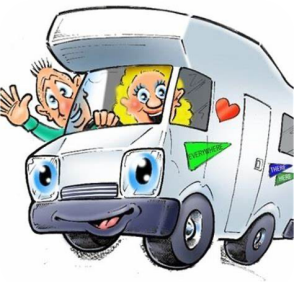
Hot enough to melt the ice

Happy trails to you... Until we meet again

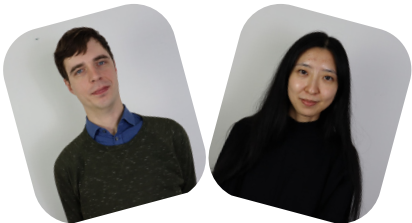

Welcome Anne and Artem

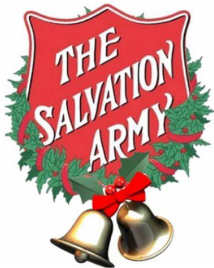
